

Students will learn how to achieve low, mid, and high fades using a variety of cutting techniques and tools that include clipper-over-comb, clipper with guards, shear work and texturizing shears through hands-on practice on their mannequins. <u>Items to bring: Male mannequin &amp; stand; Combs (all-purpose, clipper, flat top, taper); Clippers &amp; guards; Shears &amp; blending shears; Spray water bottle; 2 terry cloth towels.</u></p>
